

Program Note:

The New England boys of the mid-nineteenth century who ran away to sea either from the poor chances of farms, factories or the restrictions of Puritan homesteads found new lives in the South Seas, in the Orient, in Malaysia and the slave and ivory coasts of Africa. Life on ship-board was not easy. The weather, bad food, the cat-o'nine-tails and long voyages were not to be easily endured. But they made the gaudy nights on shore all the more violent, and safe stay at home for any length of time even after two endless years afloat, nearly an impossibility. 

Program Note:

Many cowboy ballads still sing the myth of William Bonney known to the Mexicans as El Chivato, simply "The Kid." He was a heroic incident in that westward march which made a sprawling continent of the United States of America. The many fine qualities which he had were cancelled out by his terrible talent for murder, the ultimate expression of a lonely individualism.

Billy the Kid was born in New York City at the close of the Civil War and his life coincided with the opening of our last frontier. At the age of 12 he killed his first man to protect his mother, a poor widow of a pioneer. Before he had reached 21 he had shot a man for each year of his life, "not counting" as he said, "niggers and Mexicans." In the ballet the character "Alias" recurs in different situations as a symbol of these men whom Billy shot with never one second of guilt, remorse or fright. Billy was a handsome, charming, courteous boy, a fine dancer, a great favorite with the Mexicans and the ranchers' daughters but he carried the border law of "get your man before he gets you" to its logical conclusion.

In a lawless land he could never be reconciled to the arrival of law and order. When his only friend, Pat Garrett, turned sheriff, Billy knew that it was a question of his getting Garrett or of Garrett's getting him. After innumerable captures and escapes, Garrett finally ambushed the Kid as he lay unarmed and asleep in the home of his mysterious Mexican sweetheart.


